Currently, MACVSO is a 501(c)(4) organization, which allows for unlimited lobbying. Corporate or public contributions to a 501(c)(4) are not currently tax deductible like they are for a 501(c)(3). Additionally, as a nonprofit with funding only from membership fees and government grants, we currently fall outside of the regulatory requirements of registering with the Minnesota Attorney General's Office. Executive Director has recommended to the E-Board that if they want to pursue corporate sponsorship that a separate 501(c)(3) will have to be created. A cost/benefit analysis will have to be done. Executive Director currently recommends instead of corporate sponsorship we pursue additional government grants. Requests are in to start the process of funding the Technical Assistance Coordinators in next years Legislature.
